The 23rd Annual Kumquat Festival is coming up and Kumquat Growers, Inc. is predicting a strong harvest for the event. The festival celebrates the "little gold gem of the citrus industry" and Dade City's status as home to the top kumquat and kumquat producer in the United States.

This year's celebration will be held Jan. 25 from 9 a.m. to

5 p.m. in downtown Dade City. Dade City Police Report Suspect Facing Multiple Charges Including Strangulation

Ramiro Lee Castro, 26, of 15141 Manatee



Ave., was arrested by Dade City police on Dec. 28 on charges of possession of methamphetamine, possession of a controlled substance, fleeing to elude a police officer, and on multiple

Pasco County warrants for burglary of a dwelling – unoccupied, two for burglary of a dwelling – occupied, domestic battery by strangulation, battery, criminal mischief, failure to appear, and three charges for violation of probation. Subdivision Plans, **Annexations To Be Considered**

The construction of 336 new singlefamily homes in Dade City may clear an initial hurdle on Thursday.

The Dade City Planning Board will consider requests by three different parties during its meeting at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall, 38020 Meridian Ave.

The developers of Suwanee Lakeside are requesting approval of a subdivision preliminary plan that would allow them to construct 301 single-family homes on property between Howard Avenue and Thomas Jefferson Street.

Also, the developers of Countryside

are requesting approval of a subdivision preliminary plan that would allow them to construct 25 single-family homes on property on the east side of the 13100 block of U.S. 301.

And Habitat for Humanity of East & Central Pasco is requesting approval of a subdivision preliminary plan that would allow them to construct 10 single-family homes. The Cove will be located north of Main Avenue between 15th and 17th streets.

Dade City Commissioners will hold public hearings on all of these three applicant's requests during their Jan. 14 meeting that will begin at 5:30 p.m.

City Addresses Merchants' Concerns

Stormwater Work Will Affect More Than Festival

Citing pedestrian and vendor safety, the City of Dade City Commission unanimously approved a change order with Kamminga & Roodvoets Construction (K & R) to temporarily pave Pasco Avenue prior to the Greater Dade City Chamber's signature event, the Kumquat Festival, which occurs Jan. 25.

Before and after the commission's decision, city administration continues to work with K & R and the local merchants as the project advances. To minimize physical and fiscal effects for both the city and its merchants, city administration and K & R revised the construction schedule and planned street closures.

After the Kumquat Festival, Seventh Street will be closed between Church and Pasco avenues for approximately one month to complete construction of the stormwater improvements and provide a staging area for equipment and materials. Pasco Avenue will remain open to two-way traffic between Seventh and Fifth streets until water main construction begins (anticipated March). In addition to bringing the construction project back on schedule, the revised plan minimizes construction damage to Pasco Avenue.

Customer convenience is also being addressed for one of the most common questions from our business owners and their customers: "Where do I park?" Through a partnership with our local business community, the city has secured permission from several private property owners to be able to utilize their existing parking areas for public use. While Seventh Street is closed, in addition to the on-street parking available in the surrounding blocks, customers can utilize the city's public parking areas on Eighth Street and Pasco Avenue, as well as Bank of America and the former site for San Antonio Credit Union on Church Avenue,

"We have been meeting with the Chamber and our businesses to address concerns for not only the Kumquat Festival, but also daily customers and visitors to the downtown. Unfortunately, construction is messy. The city is making every effort possible to meet the needs of our community while dealing with the realities of construction," City Manager Leslie Porter said.

As you are driving in the downtown area, Dade City encourages visitors to watch for construction crewmembers and yield to all the construction signs and workers. Traffic patterns and detours will change in the upcoming weeks as construction continues.

Spotlight On Talent Deadline Nears

Big Prize Money, Trophies Part Of The Annual Show

Those wishing to participate in the 37th annual Spotlight on Talent competition have two weeks to get prepared, Barbara Friedman said Monday.

"This is our area's version of 'America's Got talent'," said Friedman, the producer of the competition, said of the event that this year takes place Jan. 23. The event will give those who dream of performing onstage, or who have plans to earn a performing arts college scholarship to prepare first in a local competition, Friedman said.

The last few years have been recordbreaking for "Spotlight on Talent." Several hundred students participate each year, with judges evaluating about 100 different acts. The final competitions will be on March 7 at the theater at Wesley Chapel High School. The matinee at 12 p.m. will be younger finalists and the evening show at 7 p.m. will be older competitors.

Tickets for adults are \$12 or both shows for \$20. For students through high school the fee is \$6, both shows for \$10 (under 5 is free).

Cruise-In Draws Rare Customized Car

A rare 1939 Willys Overland snarknose sedan was displayed during Saturday's rain dampened Cruise-In held in downtown Dade City.

Bill Tessara of Dade City has owned it for about a year.

Its previous owner spent 11 years converting the Willys from a dragster to a street rod.

He worked on the Willys for about a year, Tessara said, before getting it to its current shape.

"I spent a lot of time and a lot of money on that car," Tessara said.

He traded a 1955 Chevrolet dragster, also known as a gasser, for the Willys,

Tessara said.

The sedan sports a two-tone paint job and has an all steel body. Fiberglass parts, including hoods, were frequently used on gassers, which his Willys used to be, Tessara said.

The car is mounted on a 1940 Willys frame and sports coil over suspension. Power is derived from a 355-cubicinch Chevrolet V-8 and is transmitted through a Chevrolet Turbo 400 automatic transmission. Wildwood brakes have been installed to make it come to a quick and safe stop.

Willys sedans are rare cars, Tessara said, because the majority of racers used coupes or pickup trucks.

inside the car. It has 17" wheels mounted on the rear and 14" wheels on the front.
