Roberts Leads Lady Pirates

Pasco's Rachel Roberts' play on the mound and at the plate Tuesday night was enough to spearhead the Pirates to a 10-6 victory against rival Zephyrhills.


Roberts came on to pitch in the fourth inning in relief of Jordyn Kadlub with the Pirates trailing 4-2. The junior shut down the Zephyrhills' bats and then took command at the plate.

In the Pirates three-run fifth, Roberts

Pasco Struggling To Score Softball Squad Can't Capitalize On Opportunities

The Pasco Pirates (1-2) have had a difficult start to the softball season after winning their opening game.

"Opportunities on offense are the biggest difference right now. We have been starting out flat and taking a few innings to get ready," coach Joshua Smith said. "We are hitting it right at people and that is stopping us from cracking the game open."

In their Feb. 15 game against Cypress

Creek (2-1) the Pirates attempted a comeback, fighting back from a 10-2 score, but came up short, 10-6.

"A few timely hits and we get the win," Smith said.

Senior and starting center fielder Kacie Huber has been big on the offensive side of the game, being the only player on either team to not record an out, going 2 for 2 with a walk, a run batted in, and two runs scored.



On the mound, junior Jordyn Kadlub had pitched two of the team's first three games, including a 7-1 loss to Sunlake on Monday. Kadlub pitched a lot better than what the score indicated and she was able to complete the game on the mound. Even in defeat, Smith was able to see the positivity in Kadlub's performance.

"Jordyn is a grinder on the mound. She is coming off a five-month layoff, which affected her control on the mound. I still have all the faith in the world in her."

Offensively, the bats were shut down by Sunlake (3-0), as the team was only able to score in the bottom of the fourth inning when Huber scored on freshman Kelsey Kadlub's RBI single, which made the game 6-1. The Pirates had some early miscues on defense, which led to the Seahawks scoring early, including plating five runs in the fourth inning.

belted a two-run home run to leftfield to put the Pirates in the lead 5-4. She was 3-for-4 with a single, double and the home run. She scored two runs and finished with a pair of RBIs.

"Everybody got hyped and everybody wanted to win," Roberts said of the comeback. "After the home run, everybody got even more hyped."

The Pirates looked vulnerable with their ace Kadlub pitching with back pain in the third inning, but Roberts filled in nicely with three shutout innings until yielding a pair of runs in the bottom of the seventh.

"One of the goals the girls set was to play all seven innings and they showed a lot of resilience this season and fight back," said first-year coach Josh Smith. "Our motto this year is to keep plugging away and keep working."

He noted that Roberts was a prime example of how the Pirates never give up.

"The big home run by Roberts and she threw really well for us. That was exciting for us. She really threw a great game down the stretch."

The Bulldogs held a 4-2 lead after four innings before the Pirates got to freshman hurler Hayley Myers with three runs in the fifth and a pair in the sixth. Senior

reliever Kaleigh Rhoden stepped in and pitched well before the defense failed her.

"We had the lead and gave it away," said Lady Bulldogs coach Jarrett Myers. "Errors don't help either and we gave some runs away late."

The Bulldogs finished with eight hits on the night, but couldn't get the clutch hits when they needed them.



Comradery, Confidence Returns Next Month

The Women Build is a way for women to come together, support each other, learn some new skills and support the organization.

"Our experience is once they get involved with the Women Build they get excited and start volunteering with other events, which are free," said Jere Ferguson of Habitat for Humanity of East & Central Pasco County. "It is an event that allows women to come together, learn new skills, support each other and have fun while they're doing it."

All women are welcome during Habitat for Humanity's annual Women Build two-day event.

The next Women Build will be held March 16 and 17 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., at

38414 Roosevelt Ave., in Dade City.

Novices should not shy away as leaders will teach them everything they need to know and all equipment, tools and safety gear will be provided. Partner families who are earning their required volunteer hours with Habitat will be on site to assist.

Ferguson said a great percentage of the community affected by affordable housing is made up of women, especially single moms, making it even more important for women to work together at builds.

There is a registration fee of \$50 required for one day of participation, which helps raise money for Habitat's house building projects. The fee includes a T-shirt, a goodie bag, lunch and a light breakfast.

There are only 50 slots available for each day of the build and pre-registration

is required by visiting habitatpasco.org or the link can be found on the Habitat for Humanity of East and Central Pasco's Facebook page. As of Tuesday, Ferguson said about half of the slots for each day were filled.

"It's one of our most popular events. We've never had a [Women Build] that wasn't sold out or a huge success," he said. "They should be ready to have some fun and have an exciting and purposeful day."

National Women Build week is in May, and the local Habitat will have a Women Build event to celebrate that on May 12. Since it is usually very hot by May they always plan the two-day fundraising Women Build earlier in the year.

Depending on public interest, the May Women Build may be extended to two days as well. Also, depending on public interest, another Women Build date might be added in April.



Woman Wins Car From Auto Dealer

Rene Smith of Dade City won a 2001 Ford Taurus during a drawing held earlier this month at Automax Sales and Service.

Automax opened in November, said Alex Alcedo, its owner. The drawing was part of a grand opening for the dealership located at 15217 U.S. 301, next to Bahr's

Automax's customers buy vehicles there and pay the dealer rather than financing them through the bank. This helps them to reestablish their credit, Alcedo said.

Smith and her children had been without a vehicle for a while after Hurricane Irma came through the area in September and had to walk to wherever they were going.

She was able to save enough money to buy a used car but it wasn't very reliable, Alcedo said. Smith frequently visited Automax to see if they had another vehicle that better suited her needs.

She planned to use her income tax refund to make a down payment on a vehicle.

Smith registered for the drawing after Alcedo told her about it and she ended up winning the Taurus that only had 80,000 miles on it and had been well maintained.




Leona Mann Hall
