Veteran Recalls Korean Conflict Marine Won't Forget

'The Forgotten War'

It has been 68 years since he was deployed to Korea but Murdoch Ford remembers it like it was yesterday.

Korea," he said.

Ford was a Private First Class and while still at age 15 – was promoted to Corporal while he was on a ship going to Korea.

"They promoted me because of my job. I was a tank driver," Ford said.

His tank, which was called Lulu, was a M26 Pershing that was a leftover from World War II. Ford said there were five tanks in his company. The company's primary objective was to locate and destroy enemy tanks and support both the Marine Corps and the U.S. Army. "We went wherever we were sent," Ford said.

Ford, 83, of Zephyrhills, joined the U.S. Marine Corps when he was just 15 years old and living in Bayonne, N.J.

He and his siblings had been orphaned and he was the oldest of five children so Ford joined the Marine Corps to help provide some money.

"I made \$84 a month," Ford said.

The Korean War began June 5, 1950; the day he graduated from boot camp at Parris Island, S.C.

Marine Corps Band Strikes A Chord

Thousands Enjoy Patriotic Music On The Courthouse Lawn

Murdoch Ford, 83, stood ramrod straight as the U.S. Marine Corps Parris Island Band played the Armed Forces Medley to close out an hour-long program on March 26.

"Oh, I love the band. I'd travel 100 miles just to see them," said Ford, of Zephyrhills, who had been a tank commander during the Korean War.

He enlisted in the Marine Corps when he was 15 years old to help provide money for his mother and four siblings. He made \$84 a month.

The Korean War started the day Ford finished boot camp - June 5, 1950. "We had never heard of Korea," he said.

He was joined by about 2,500 other people to enjoy the band's music outside the Historic Courthouse in Dade City. The Marine musicians were greeted with a standing ovation and a resounding round of applause as they took their places on the north side of the courthouse square at 3 p.m.

"It's great to be here on such a nice day," said the band's commander, MSgt. Daniel J. Sullivan.

Small American flags lined Seventh Street for a couple of miles in each direction and surrounded the old courthouse to add patriotic emphasis for the band's visit.

"It made my day to hear 'Stars and Stripes Forever'," said Brian Uppercue of the Dade City Police Department.

The crowd was seated several rows deep in a semicircle from the east side of the lawn all the way around to the west side. It was the first time county commissioners ever allowed seating on the courthouse lawn, which is a restricted area; throngs of people were also sitting or standing along Seventh and Sixth Streets and Meridian

Avenue.

Several folks said they were enthusiastic about the band's performance.

"It's magnificent," said Steve Brown of the Rotary Club of Dade City.

Allen Altman said numerous people were to thank for organizing the band's Dade City appearance.

They included Greg and Cynthia Armstrong from the Chasco Festival, the Pasco County Commissioners, the Greater Dade City Chamber of Commerce, Dade City Public Works, Dade City Police Department, Pasco County Fire Rescue and Beef O'Brady's.

Beef's owner Todd Bachelor made sure the band had a meal before setting up the 12,000 pounds of equipment that is used at each performance.

"I think this is wonderful. We need to do all that we

can to support our people who are in uniform," said Linae Paulson, a volunteer with Habitat for Humanity of East & Central Pasco.

It was announced following the event that the U.S. Marine Corps Parris Island Band would definitely be visiting Dade City again next year.

Prior to the performance, Bob Hatfield, an aide to U.S. Rep. Gus Bilirakis, R-FL (12), was presented with a Friend of Farm Bureau award from state Sen. Wilton Simpson, president of Pasco County Farm Bureau. The congressman was unable to attend because of an illness in his family.

One of the people watching the band play was quickly, quietly and professionally cared for by Pasco County Fire Rescue CFR with the assistance of DCPD, after the gentleman became short of breath while standing during the national anthem.




tennis were also night time activities on the lighted courts. Residents enjoyed their appreciation day and the "Last Hoorah" party.

Mental Wellness

How about a fresh start this season with a positive attitude? Mental health is defined as "a state of well-being in which the individual realizes his or her own abilities, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and fruitfully, and is able to make a contribution to his or her community".

When relationships, financial issues or work environment overwhelm us, and our coping skills are poor, we can suffer from stress. Stress can be acute and manifest as anger, depression and anxiety, and also cause physical symptoms like chest pain, palpitations, headache etc. Stress can also lead to heart attacks and stroke. When an individual's stress becomes chronic, the risk for harming themselves or others increases.

People with mental health problems

get well, and often recover completely with treatment and help. It is important to be aware of warning signs of a mental health problem and seek professional help if needed. Eating or sleeping too much or too little, loss of interest in usual activities, feeling helpless, having low energy, mood swings, inability to concentrate and thoughts of harm to oneself or others, are some of the warning signs of a mental health problem.

Good mental health is about developing positive coping skills, while avoiding negative coping skills, through practice. Good coping skills include the use of relaxation techniques when stressed, staying physically active, getting adequate sleep, connecting with others, setting time aside for vacations or hobbies, helping others and praying. Negative coping skills like drugs, excessive alcohol use, storing hurt feelings or denial can be harmful to mental health.

Looking after your mental health can positively impact your physical health, relationships, financial status and productivity. You can realize your full potential by making your mental wellness a top priority.



Rural King Due In Zephyrhills Supply Store Going Into Former Kmart Site

Rural King Supply has announced plans to open a store in mid July inside the former Kmart in the Town View Square.

The company will employ between 75 and 80 full and part-time workers for the retail operation and will be using local electricians, plumbers and demolition workers to refurbish the 85,000-square-foot storefront.

Rural King spent about a year planning its move to 7422 Gall Blvd., which will be its 101st store in the country and the eighth in Florida, according to Brian Hutchins, the company's vice president of Business and Development.

"We're excited about the Zephyrhills store pushing us over the 100 mark," he said. "We will be bringing several millions of dollars of retail sales to the area."

The demographics of Zephyrhills

attracted Rural King to the area, Hutchins said.

"We are a farm and home store and we depend a lot on agricultural and rural customers. We have food items, lawn and garden items and pet food so we feel we have a lot to offer everybody," he said.

Rural King also carries hardware and automotive items, tools, sporting goods, housewares, clothing, footwear, toys and domestic items according to the company's website.

"There's a lot of business out there for all of us," Hutchins said regarding other retail stores that Rural King will be competing against, most notably TSC Tractor Supply across the street at 7431 Gall Blvd.

The Mattoon, Ill.-based company aims to open the Zephyrhills store as well as new stores in Ocala and Gainesville on July 17, with an eye on setting up more stores in the Sunshine State.
