## **Bragging Rights On The Line** Second 'Battle Of The Parks' Nears

What mobile home park has the best golfers? No matter whom you ask, you will probably get a different answer.

Are the golfers from Baker Acres the elite duffers in Zephyrhills? Or could it be the golfers from Happy Days, Majestic Oaks, Southport Springs or the dozens of other parks?

Currently, Betmar holds the bragging rights for golf supremacy in Zephyrhills after winning last year's inaugural Battle of the Parks golf tournament at Lake Bernadette. The fine golfers at Betmar were crowned the best out of last year's field of 92 golfers.

This year, Betmar will try to defend its crown when the 2018 tournament tees up Jan. 23 at Lake Bernadette.

The tournament, sponsored by Florida Hospital Zephyrhills, is hoping to exceed last year's total of players, according to Andi Ryer at the Pro Shop at Lake Bernadette. The format again this year is a four-person scramble with an entry fee of \$35 per player, which includes golf, a cart and lunch.

"It's for bragging rights," Ryer said. "It's a big deal for us, the players and Florida Hospital Zephyrhills. All of the tournaments we host here are big deals."

Ryer recommends that players get their money and foursome registered early to avoid getting locked out.

"We'll see how many players return from last year and how many new players we have," Ryer said. "There are more than 200 parks in the Zephyrhills area with golfers who would like those bragging rights."

# **Elite Soccer Skills Academy Due To Open This Month**

### **Director:** Training To **Provide Path To Pros**

A new soccer training facility will open this month after construction wraps up at One Pasco Center on State Road 52, east of I-75.

The Elite Soccer Skills Academy will offer training for players ages 6-16 and coaches as well as parent programs that

include nutrition classes to help them prepare meals for their aspiring young athletes.

"We want to be able to create opportunity, a proper, solid opportunity for youngsters," academy director Adam Murray said.

The opportunity Murray refers to is a high chance of playing soccer professionally.

"We expect that players who are 14, 15, or 16, if they're still with us, to have a 95 percent opportunity to be signed by a professional coach here," Murray said. "They'd certainly have a very, very good chance to get signed or have a scholarship opportunity in UK or Europe."

Coaches at the Academy are UEFA Pro licensed coaches, which is the highest World Soccer Coaching qualification.

Murray emphasized that the academy is for players who are serious about a career in soccer, not those who use the sport as a pastime. The training program at the academy will feature assessments every six weeks, much like a progress

report in public schools. Players would be monitored during this time period and must reach a certain level of mastery over different areas of the sport and will be able to continue their training with the academy if they meet certain criteria.

The Elite Soccer Skills Academy will also offer workshops for local coaches and have outreach programs for local schools to help train coaches.

# Let The Clubhead Take Up Space



## at Silverado Golf & Country Club

This is such a simple concept but one I have just started instituting into my game after 15 years of teaching. The phrase and the thought are simple but sometimes hard to allow yourself to do.

The idea to "allow the clubhead to take up space" is relevant from putter to driver, but I believe most needed in chipping, bunker play and irons.

A driver is usually swung "too hard" or the swing is "too long," so I am less worried about instructing my students to take up space here. With the putter, I definitely see some jabby strokes, not smoothness with good shoulder rotation up and down. When one becomes "handsy" in putting motions (or in chipping or bunker play or shorter irons) it usually leads to bad results.

Let me try to describe what I mean by "allow the clubhead to take up space" a little more clearly and see how we can add it into your game.

Simply, from the initial takeaway, allow the clubhead to move low to the ground then work on creating hinge at the top of the backswing. No matter if the top of the backswing is a 1/2 swing to produce a high, lofted chip shot or a longer backswing, "creating proper hinge" at the top of the backswing is crucial to good ball striking. This "hinging" idea can only be accomplished with the clubhead essentially moving more than the grip



is moving. In physics terms, this should make sense: the amount of space the clubhead takes up in relationship to the grip is significantly larger. (Read that last sentence and don't move on until you get that.) The clubhead is further away from the center of your swing, so the circumference of the movement will be bigger than the grip which is closer to the center of your swing.

With that being said, we as golfers seem to want to inhibit the clubhead from moving in many different areas of the swing. Most importantly, at impact we often decide we are done and don't need to continue the swing to its rightful and full conclusion. Or worse yet, just before impact we decide we need to help the ball up in the air and now the clubhead outraces the grip too much, which produces fat or thin shots depending on weight transfer.

Bottom line – work with creating a softer grip through impact to allow the clubhead to have more motion (speed) just before and after impact. The clubs are designed to elevate the ball without you adding loft. Practice (don't play), practice with a little more weight on your back foot through impact. This will allow the clubhead to pass your hands and again create speed.
