

In the Pirates three-run fifth, Roberts belted a two-run home run to leftfield to put the Pirates in the lead 5-4. She was 3-for-4 with a single, double and the home run. She scored two runs and finished with a pair of RBIs.

"Everybody got hyped and everybody wanted to win," Roberts said of the comeback. "After the home run, everybody got even more hyped."

The Pirates looked vulnerable with their ace Jordyn Kadlub pitching with back pain in the third inning, but Roberts filled in nicely with three shutout innings until yielding a pair of runs in the bottom of the seventh.

"One of the goals the girls set was to play all seven innings and they showed a lot of resilience this season and fight back," said first-year coach Josh Smith.

Earle, Marshman Inducted Into Hall Of Fame



Saddle Up For Charity

Sheriff's Office Maintains Tradition

Horse lovers woke up bright and early on Saturday for the chance to ride along private trails while raising money for a good cause.

The annual ride put on by the Pasco County Sheriff's Office welcomed about 100 riders and their horses to raise money for Bridging Freedom and U.S. Institute Against Human Trafficking.

Established in 2008, the rides were formerly known as Ride for Hospice and for eight years raised more than \$150,000 for Gulfside Hospice. However, the ride was then changed to Saddle Up For Charity and for the past two years has been benefitting the new cause.

"When [human trafficking] became so huge in our county our sheriff asked if we would change our recipient," said Deputy Margaret Bushell, co-organizer of Saturday's ride. "The past two rides have been raising funds to fight the battle against child sex slavery and human trafficking."

While a total of funds raised were not known at press time, Bushell said money raised from this ride would help fund two specific projects with the charities. One is supporting a facility being built in the county for a therapeutic riding program, which will include a ranch, corral and have horses to help victims heal. The other will go toward a home for boys who have been rescued.

Saddle Up For Charity began at Bushell's farm in Dade City, Diamond B Ranch. To accommodate for the six-mile ride, riders crossed over from Buschell's farm into the adjoining Melton family ranches. Bushell said "horse people are always looking for something to do with their horses," and a private trail is a great way to have a good time and raise money.

"When I was out there riding around ... I recognized so many faces that support our unit year after year by coming out and pledging money to our ride," Bushell said.

During the ride, a stop was made at Steve Melton's agricultural museum. Horses were able to stop for a water break,

refreshments were given to riders and they were also allowed to peruse the museum to view old-timey machinery and gadgets.

Rosecastle of Zephyrhills provided a bus for the day to shuttle people who did not have a horse to ride but who wanted to participate in the fundraiser. They were driven to the museum for the rendezvous and explored the museum as well.

Poker run stops were set up along the run, and Karen Iverson won a Yeti cooler for having the best hand.

The ride ended back at Diamond Ranch where everyone was served lunch. Raffles and auction items were dispersed, all donated from different sponsors.

"It's not the sheriff's office donating the money. It's all these sponsors who believe in what we believe in who are really donating the money and all the riders who come out and ride," Bushell said.

One of the big prizes, \$400 off a set of Cooper tires, which were donated by Norm & Sons Tire & Auto Repair in Zephyrhills, was won by Donna Black.




