Former ZHS Pitcher Finds The Zone

There was a point at which Austin Adams struggled to throw a strike and did not see the field in college. Now, he's someone the Washington Nationals are watching closely.

In his first two seasons at the University of South Florida, the Zephyrhills native allowed 17 runs and 23 walks in just 10 innings.

In 2017, however, the Syracuse Chiefs (Nationals Triple-A affiliate) reliever is determined to showcase his talent to the

The win gives Zephyrhills its third consecutive season sweep of Pasco. The Pirates have not registered a win against the Bulldogs since 2014.

"This team drives me nuts, but they are grinding out every game," said Bulldog Coach Rusty Guynn.

It was a battle of sophomore left-handed

pitchers through the first five innings. Bulldog hurler Jaydon Bishop, who picked up the win, kept the Pirates at bay through five innings. He went the distance allowing four runs and striking out six.

For the Pirates, Garrett Hester tossed a gem, striking out eight and allowing just two hits, before leaving the game in the seventh.

"It was scary-fun," Bishop said of giving up four runs and then watching his team come back with five.

"It's like riding a roller coaster for the first time, fun. I pitched well and then I left a couple over the plate and they hit it, but my defense got me out of it."

The seventh-inning rally started when Tyrese Wigfall scored on a hit by Dalton Gold. The Bulldogs loaded the bases with a walk and a batter hit. A passed ball scored Gold and Trey Owens to make the score 4-3. Austin Putz walked and Marcus Gonzales stood at third with one out.

The Pirates brought in Luby Fields in relief to face ZHS cleanup hitter Kolbe Lupinek.

A wild pitch scored Gonzales, moving Putz into scoring position. Lupinek drilled one to shortstop but the ball is bobbled and the throw was late to first allowing Putz to bolt home and slide safely with the game-winner.

"It has been a long time since they beat us and we weren't going to let it happen

tonight," said Putz. "It feels so good. They are a good team and they came close this year."

Bishop and the rest of the Bulldogs brought heightened emotion and intensity to a peak in the dugout during the final at-bat.

"Once we got the first two runners on, the emotion in the dugout caught like fire sparks. It was quick," Bishop said. "It went from down sitting on the bench to up on the fence screaming. Honestly, that's the way it should be for every game.

"Hopefully we can bring that energy with us Thursday."

That's when the Bulldogs are back in action at home against Wesley Chapel in another district clash.

a new organization.

This past winter, Adams, who has a knack for generating whiffs (61 strikeouts in 41.1 innings for the Double-A Arkansas Travelers in 2016), was dealt to the Nationals as a part of a trade that sent second baseman Danny Espinosa to Los Angeles.

"It was unexpected, but once I got that news, it was pretty awesome," he said. "I'm really blessed to have such a wonderful opportunity with the Nationals." Although he struggled early in his collegiate

with a 1.95 ERA in 18 appearances, while striking out 34 and walking 10 in 27.2 innings. It was a performance strong enough to justify the Angels selecting him in the 8th round of the 2012 MLB draft.

Adams said the difference-maker heading into his senior year was a newfound confidence in his ability and extensive work with former USF pitching coach and current Atlanta Braves pitching coach Chuck Hernandez.

"I remember having countless conversations with

Nationals in hopes for a major league opportunity in career, Adams blossomed his junior year going 1-2 him and he was always very passionate about his job," Adams said. "He made it very clear I had the talent to play at the next level."

> With that in his past, Adams is now one rung below the big leagues and in his first two Triple-A outings, he has been dominant striking out eight in 4.2 scoreless innings. If all goes well, this could be the year he makes it to 'the big dance.'

> "It's what all the work up to this point has been for," he said. "I'm really looking forward to the opportunity when they need me."

Bulldogs Take Care Of Anclote Gold Shines In Sterling Mound Performance

Zephyrhills jumped out to an early lead and never looked back Friday night taking down Anclote, 4-1 in a Class 6A-District 7 matchup at John Clements Field.

The Bulldogs (6-11 overall, 4-4 in district play) put a pair of runs on the board in the bottom of the first thanks to an RBI double by Austin Putz that scored Marcus Gonzales.

Putz advanced to third when Kolbe Lupinek reached on an error. Lupinek's pinch runner Shannon Oney stole second setting up coach Rusty Guynn's creative baserunning to manufacture a run. Oney led so far off second as to set up a pickoff attempt and force a rundown between second and third while Putz dashed down from third to score.

Guynn saw the opportunity and took it. "They had it on," Guynn said. "I verbally told him (Putz) that as soon as they do it to take off. The pitcher must make a perfect throw, fielder must come down in the grass to make a perfect throw. He went back and stayed in the rundown and got the run across."

Zephyrhills added another run in the second when Trey Owens scored from third on a sacrifice fly off the bat of Gonzalez. The Bulldogs added a run in the fifth when Jaydon Bishop scored on a wild pitch.

Dalton Gold pitched six innings allowing the one run while fanning seven and walking just one.

"He threw the ball well," Guynn said of Gold's clutch performance on the mound. "He battled and kept us in the game."

The pitching is helping the Bulldogs remain close in tight games and that could be the key to advance in the district tournament.

"Our pitching is bringing it all together," said Gonzales. "They are limiting walks and the defense has played OK behind them. We must play better defense, pitch and get the signs down. When we have runners on, we keep failing to get the bunt down.

"Last year, we didn't hit the ball well. We relied on pitching, defense and playing small ball. If we can do that, we'll be tough to beat in the district."

Guynn said the Bulldogs would go as far as the pitching takes them.

"We have enough pitching to get through it," Guynn said. "We have to keep throwing strikes. We control what we do. Wherever we end up, we still have to play tough in the district tournament."

Free Water Safety Lessons Provided To Underserved Students Tampa Metropolitan Area YMCA Offers Service To Two Elementary Schools Through \$6,000 Grant

Students at Lacoochee Elementary School and at an elementary school in Tampa will receive free water safety lessons through a \$6,000 grant that the Tampa Metropolitan Area YMCA recently received.

Both Lacoochee Elementary in Pasco County and Mort Elementary in Hillsborough County are Title I schools. A Title I school has a high number or percentage of students from low-income families.

The Safety Around Water Program that will be

implemented for Lacoochee and Mort are part of the will most likely cover the remaining cost so no one will YMCA's commitment to reduce drowning rates and keep kids safe in and around the water.

The YMCA of the USA presented the grant.

The details are still being worked out with the schools for exactly how the programs will be carried out, said communications director Lalita Llerena.

Students are not required to participate, but the YMCA hopes to include every child that does want to participate. If the \$6,000 grant, split between the two schools, does not cover every student, Llerena said the Y

be excluded who wants to learn water safety.

"We're very grateful to be able to offer our drowning prevention efforts to a broader scope," Llerena said. "Now we're actually able to go inside an in-need school and get the students who need it the most, bring them to a Y and serve them. Otherwise some of these kids may have not ever gotten the opportunity to come to a Y or even swim in a pool."

Lacoochee students will be bussed to the local YMCA for the lessons for about six to eight weeks. The lessons will cater to the students' needs, whether they are comfortable jumping right into the pool or have never swam before. For students who have never swam, Llerena said it is not guaranteed they will be swimming by the end, but they will learn valuable information in order to further their interest in learning.

Data shows children from low-income families are four times more likely to drown. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, drowning is the second-leading cause of death for children ages one to 14 years old. In ethnically diverse communities, the youth drowning rate is two to three times higher than the national average, according to a USA Swimming study. Additionally, nearly six out of 10 African American and Hispanic/Latino children are unable to swim, nearly twice as many as their Caucasian counterparts.

The Y's Safety Around Water program teaches children of all ages and backgrounds that water should be fun, not feared, if you know how to stay safe in and around water. Additionally, Safety Around Water educates parents about the importance of water safety lessons.

"Educating children how to be safe around water is just as important as teaching them to look both ways before they cross the street," says Association Aquatics Experience Executive Amanda Walker.
