

Lions Club Delivers Precious Gift

Sight Program Helps Those In Desperate Need Of Glasses

On the first Thursday of each month, the Zephyrhills Lions Club welcomes Pasco County residents needing guidance in a major sense: their sight.

Historically, Lions Clubs across the nation have focused on serving the community, but with a focus in helping those who are blind or visually impaired.

So, on these first Thursdays, the next being Aug. 3, committee members of the club's Sight Program welcome applicants who are in need of assistance regarding their vision. The club aims to help those who lack or have low income, or unsubstantial or zero insurance to provide their own vision care. Located at 5827 Dean Dairy Road, applications from any county resident are accepted and reviewed from 11 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Once accepted to the program, the Lions Club will schedule an appointment at one of two participating optometrists, Eye Clinic of Florida or Florida Medical Clinic Eye Care, for a routine eye exam. The club will cover the exam as well as glasses if needed.

Bilirakis Applauds Passage Of Bill To Help Veterans

U.S. Rep. Gus Bilirakis (R-FL-12), Vice Chairman of the House Veterans' Affairs Committee, recently applauded passage of the Harry. W. Colmery Veterans Education Assistance Act, H.R. 3218, in the House of Representatives. The bill extends and improves the GI Bill providing education assistance to veterans and their surviving spouses and dependents. It also includes a provision authored by Bilirakis to modernize GI Bill claims processing in the Department of Veterans Affairs.

"The GI Bill empowers our nation's heroes to invest in themselves and their futures. Our legislation passed today expands access to education and workforce training programs that will help veterans enter a new chapter of their lives upon returning home from their service. I am especially proud that this bill includes my provision to update the VA's Information Technology systems for more efficient GI Bill claims processing. Overall, the House took a major step today in improving, expanding and modernizing the GI Bill for our Veterans," said Bilirakis. its Information Technology systems for processing GI Bill claims. This would help ensure Veterans are able to receive their benefits in a more timely and

The Harry W. Colmery Veterans Education Assistance Act, also called the Forever GI Bill, provides significant increases in GI Bill funding, and allows future eligible recipients to use their GI Bill benefits at any point in their lives.

Bilirakis' provision authorizes \$30 million to help the VA invest in updating

its Information Technology systems for processing GI Bill claims. This would help ensure Veterans are able to receive their benefits in a more timely and efficient manner. It also requires the VA to submit to Congress its proposed plans for streamlining the claims process, and report to Congress a year after the changes are made.

H.R. 3218 passed the House in a unanimous, bipartisan vote, and will next be sent to the Senate for consideration.

and must undergo a blood pressure check and diabetes screening. Diabetes is often associated with compromised eyesight, according to Sight Program chair Sandy Crabtree, and although the club cannot diagnose, they will advise guests whether they should seek further medical attention based on the results of those tests.

Should the eye doctor find anything a routine eye exam cannot easily alleviate, the club will then work with the patient to acquire funding to undergo cataract surgery, corneal transplants or other major surgeries. Funding for these surgeries is acquired through the Lions Club Foundation or Florida Division of Blind Services.

Zephyrhills resident Sandra Gullion has no insurance and said she doesn't know what would have happened without the Sight Program. She first visited the program for a routine eye exam. The next two times she utilized the service she required cataract surgery in both eyes and then laser surgery.

"I went around for a long time without being able to see very much at all and if it weren't for them I probably wouldn't be able to see at all," Gullion, 58, said. "When my eyes got bad again I still had no insurance I called them up again and they were able to help me out."

Funding for the Sight Program is solely acquired from the Lions Club's Bingo hall, which is open to the public on Tuesdays and Fridays. Doors open at 3 p.m., and the first Bingo session begins at 6 p.m., followed by a second at 8 p.m. The kitchen opens at 4 p.m. and usually offers daily specials.

"[The Bingo players] are so generous with their donations. Without them this wouldn't be possible,"

Crabtree said.

Currently, the Sight Program receives anywhere from five to 25 applications per month. Going forward, Crabtree said she hopes to grow the program to a level requiring two application days per month, as it used to exist in the past.

"It's very important the public know that, yes, there is a place that can help them. You just have to show up, bring the documents and we will sit down with you and see what's going on," she said.

Three-day Event Covers Variety Of School Supplies

The 2017 Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday was passed by the Florida Legislature and signed into law by Gov. Rick Scott. This sales tax holiday begins at 12:01 a.m. on Aug. 4 and ends at 11:59 p.m. on Aug. 6.

During this sales tax holiday period, qualifying items will be exempt from tax including: certain school supplies selling for \$15 or less per item; clothing, footwear, and certain accessories selling for \$60 or less per item; and personal computers and certain computer-related accessories purchased for noncommercial home or personal use selling for \$750 or less per item.

PETA Aims To Shut Zoo *Wild Things Relocates Tigers*

After Court Orders Them Not To

People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals sought a preliminary injunction against a Dade City zoo last week after the facility sent 19 of its tigers to Oklahoma on July 16.

The July 19 hearing was held in the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Florida in Tampa, according to David W. Perle, PETA's senior media coordinator.

Perle said in a Monday email that PETA also filed a motion this week for sanctions against Dade City Wild Things, doing business at 37237 Meridian Ave.

The latest court actions follow a lawsuit PETA filed against Wild Things in 2016, that alleges 22 tigers kept at the zoo founded by Kathy Stearns were not being cared for properly.

Repeated attempts for comment from Stearns went unanswered.

On Oct. 12, 2016, a federal judge ordered Wild Things to allow PETA to


conduct an inspection.

The judge granted an emergency injunction on July 14 ordering Stearns not to remove any tigers from the facility after PETA officials reportedly learned she might attempt to do so. An inspection of Wild Things was ordered for July 20, but they were denied entry to the zoo.

"Since there are no tigers at the facility, there is nothing to inspect and we will not be doing an inspection," attorney William J. Cook reportedly said in a July 19 email to PETA's legal counsel. "It is (Stearns') view that she is not legally bound to do what she cannot do – show them tigers."

Cook reportedly informed Stearns of the order to not remove the tigers. Also last week, Cook petitioned the court to withdraw as Stearns' attorney.

Joe Maldonado of Greater Wynnewood Exotic Animal Park in Wynnewood, Okla., acknowledged 19 tigers arrived at his facility on July 16. He said he didn't know what had happened to the other

three tigers referenced in the court order.

One of the tigers reportedly gave birth to three cubs while being shipped on a cattle truck from Dade City to Oklahoma. According to Maldonado the cubs died in transit.

Wild Things was closed on Monday and Stearns was not at the zoo on Tuesday.




